

Citizens' Guide to Town Government

Town of Middlebury

Who is the Town?

The Town, a civil society with a government, is the organized community of everyone who lives here. Town government of Middlebury is made up of registered voters, elected and appointed officials and public employees. However, everyone who lives in Middlebury or receives Middlebury services may participate in government by contacting its officials or by attending any meetings or hearings, as they are all open to the public.

The Select Board is the governing body of the Town of Middlebury, with its seven members elected by the voters at the Annual Town Meeting in March. The broad duties of the Select Board, granted to it by State Statute and Town Charter, include setting policies, enacting ordinances, appointing boards and some town officials, preparing budgets for consideration at Town Meeting, and authorizing all expenditures of the Town.

The Town Manager is hired by the Select Board to serve as the Chief Administrative Officer of the Town in their stead. The Town Manager is responsible for the implementation and management of all policies, ordinances and programs enacted by the Select Board and the voters.

Departments and Offices under the authority of the Town Manager include:

- Accounting & Financial Services Department;
- Fire Department;
- Listers Office (Town Appraiser);
- Parks & Recreation Department;
- Planning & Zoning Office;
- Police Department; and
- Public Works Department (Highway, Water & Wastewater).

The Ilsley Public Library and Sarah Partridge Community Library, are town departments, but are overseen by a five member Board of Trustees elected at Town Meeting by the voters.

The Town Clerk is elected by and directly responsible to the voters and has broad authority over the operation of his/her office in accordance with the applicable provisions of Vermont State Statute, Middlebury Town Charter and Ordinances, as well as applicable Federal Laws.

Whom should I contact with questions and concerns?

First contact the appropriate Town department or office with questions or concerns. Contact information is provided below. In most cases, questions can be answered by our knowledgeable staff. Response time will vary depending on the nature and urgency of the inquiry; assistance will be dispatched immediately if life or property is threatened imminently. Maintenance and repair items are scheduled subject to availability of staff and funding. General inquires may need additional research, in which case you should receive a response in a few days. If you are uncertain about which department to contact, you should contact the Town Offices at 388-8100 or info@townofmiddlebury.org for assistance.

If you are not satisfied with the response you have received, contact the Town Manager at 388-8100 ext 201. If the appropriate department and Town Manager have both been contacted with no resolution reached, the Select Board is available to hear concerns.

How do I get an item placed on the Select Board agenda?

The Town Manager works with the Select Board Chair and Vice Chair to prepare the agenda. Requests for inclusion of an item on the Select Board agenda should be forwarded to the Town Manager's Office, 77 Main St Middlebury VT 05753 or kramsay@townofmiddlebury.org

Regular Select Board Meetings are the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month. Agendas for the meeting are set the preceding Wednesday so they can be published in advance of the meeting. Any item which requires a vote of the Select Board needs to be included on the agenda.

At each regular Select Board meeting a time is reserved for Citizen's Comments where any member of the public can bring before the Select Board any concern or topic not otherwise on the agenda. Please take note, if an action of the Board is requested, unless there is a clear and imminent danger, the item will need to be warned on a future agenda in order for the Select Board to take action.

For emergencies always dial 911

For after hour Public Works issues (Highway, Water, Wastewater) of an *urgent nature* call Police dispatch 388-3191.
